2005 Ferret Olympics

As a bit of fun we hold a Ferret Olympics at some of our social events. Past events have included the most yawns in one minute (from the ferret) and the highest number of kisses in one minute. Again, from the ferret of course.

At the Ferret Olympics held on the 25th May 2005 we had three events; the tube sprint, the ferret maze and the cup tip. The tube sprint and the maze are self-explanatory. Cup Tip

Doug & Ruth Earnshaw's Webley took Gold, knocking over 11 cups. Willie, belonging to Andy Kenny, took Silver with 9 cups knocked over, and the

Bronze medal was shared between Natalie Owen's Gizmo and Livi Parkins' Pebbles, who both knocked over 6 cups.

Ferret Maze

The Gold medal was taken by Ruth Corbett's Timmy, who seemed to be radar-guided, completing the maze in only 33 seconds, even though he's blind in one eye.

Very close behind was Eileen Sharman's Snowy in 34 seconds for the Silver. The Bronze medal went to Ruth Corbett's Barney who finished in 46 seconds.

It's particularly pleasing to be able to record that none of the competitors failed their mandatory Ferretone tests.

- The service will close with Little Drops of Water. One of the ladies will start quietly and the rest of the congregation will join in

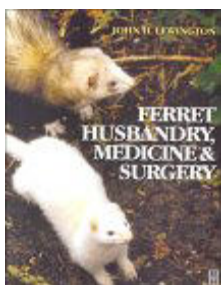
- Low Self Esteem Support Group will meet Thursday at 7 PM. Please use the back door
